Call to order- Pledge of Allegiance by Chairperson Mr. Vicchiariello at 6:00pm.

Members present: Mr. Vicchiariello, Ms. Dennison, Ms. Mann, Mr. O'Connell.

Public Comment

New Business

- Hiring- Police Officer Vacancy- Civil Service List- the committee discussed developing a plan to interview eligible candidates on the current civil service list to fill police officer vacancies. The committee will attempt to utilize the hiring committee format with citizen advisory board representation as used in August 2024 to screen candidates. Anticipated hiring dates will be announced after the new year.
- Dispatcher Candidates – The committee approved the Chief of Police’s recommendation to hire Matthew Kowal for the position of Part Time Dispatch-Clerk. This item will be placed on the agenda for the Common Meeting scheduled for 25 November for Common Council approval.
- Dept Drone- The committee was unable to conduct a review of drone capabilities due to outside weather conditions. A future demonstration will be scheduled for a later committee meeting.
- Taxicab application Denial – Appeal – The Police Committee heard an appeal filed by Sean Dawson in relation to a denial of an application for a City of Port Jervis Taxi License based upon Section 479-4(c) Sub 1(c). The committee received testimony from Mr. Dawson, reviewed documentation related to Mr. Dawson’s denial and voted 4-0 to approve the application pending consultation with Corporation Counsel.
- CompStat Report – An update was provided to the committee regarding key department statistics for the month of October 2024.
- Police/Fire Santa Run Event- The annual City of Port Jervis Santa Run sponsored by the City of Port Jervis, PD, FD, PBA and Outdoor Club of Port Jervis is being planned for Saturday December 21st. The Committee will forward this item to the Common Council for formal approval.
- Christkindl Mart Outreach – The Department is using SNUG Grant funding to host an outreach event at the Christkindl Event including hosting pony rides and a petting zoo.
- In Service and Training:

Sgt Nicole McGowan and PO Patrick Kerr attended a 24-hour course in mental health called Fundamental Crisis Intervention Skills for Law Enforcement as a trainer. Both are now certified mental health instructors and will be co-teaching and providing mental health training in partnership with Orange County Department of Mental Health at the police academy through the basic school, in-service and crisis intervention training. In addition, Sgt McGowan and Officer Kerr will be developing an in-service program for personnel during the first quarter training cycle in 2025.

Old Business

- Range Building – concrete quotes- Department is requesting quotes from three vendors to pour a concrete floor for the range building in anticipation of performing the work during the month of December.
- Technology Grant – The fire department has vetted several under water ROV units and vendors and have selected a brand from Hudson Valley Drone for purchase under the DCJS Technology Grant.
- License Plate Reader Project – Project Safe Neighborhoods Grant – A fourth fixed license plate reader site has been installed at the intersection of West Main Street and Washington Avenue using funding secured through the DCJS Technology Grant.
- Accreditation NYS DCJS – Program Grant- The department is applying for funding to support accreditation through a funding opportunity provided through Sen. Skoufis by the Division of Criminal Justice Services up to \$50,000.00.
- Pike Street Parking Complaint – The committee reviewed a complaint received previously from business owners on Pike Street regarding the feasibility of a 15 min parking sign

located on the west side of upper Pike Street. The committee will review this complaint at a later meeting.

- Admin Assistant Position statement update- The Chief updated the committee that the City of Port Jervis Civil Service Commission has examined the Administrative Assistant to the Chief of Police job statement and have re-classified this position as an Account Clerk – Typist due to the actual daily duties performed. The CSEA has communicated a desire to bargain the position into the CSEA union. A future meeting will be scheduled through Mayor Cicalese with City and CSEA officials to review the matter.
